Once A Week Can Make All The Difference

For most of us, we feel incredibly blessed living here in PebbleCreek. To a large extent, our pickleball community consists of kind, caring people that help to enhance the quality of life we live. In times of hardship, we readily reach out to offer support to those in need. We don't wait for people to ask us for assistance. We see or hear about an individual's challenge, and offer ourselves in any capacity we can.

The quality of character in our community is exceptional. It is an important foundational component required to advancing the needs of our club in a positive direction. So how do we "tap into" this character to support the needs of our club and its members <u>without waiting to be asked</u>?

...by following the simple concept, "Once A Week...

ONCE A WEEK

- Play DOWN a rating level (or more) to give our club members a chance to see a different style and/or skill level of play.
- Organize some social time with your group (or at Drop In) after playing pickleball, rather than simply heading home. Getting to know our community improves our social interaction and our overall well-being.
- Introduce yourself to new residents, renters and guests to help make them feel welcome to our club.
- Head over to the ramada and straighten the chairs after playing a session of pickleball to enhance our club's appearance.
- Check the courts to see if any balls have accidentally been left on the courts and put them in the tubes after you've finished playing. It shows you care and helps others to follow suit.
- Consider asking players in your organized groups or from Drop In to practice pickleball skills. I'll bet many would like the opportunity, but are hesitant to ask (not wanting to burden others).
- Consider mentoring players seeking guidance. "Pass it forward" as other members have done to help you attain the level of skill you possess.

If you're willing to reach out to help someone in challenging times, why not consider reaching out to one another in good times with an act of kindness and thoughtfulness. These simple action steps create a more meaningful sense of membership while reinforcing a sense of personal pride every member likely possesses.

- The treasurer position does require an accounting (not CPA) background and QuickBooks experience would make life easier.

In addition to their duties, most of the officers oversee areas that interest them; like Court Maintenance, Player Development, Tournaments, Communications, Socials and Fundraising.

Planning to no longer continue on the pickleball committee you currently volunteer for? Please notify your board liaison by email or text if you do not plan to continue your volunteer position as soon as possible, even if you plan to continue until April 1.

Time to pay your dues? You do not need to complete the Membership Application to pay your annual dues. You may pay your dues online in your Court Reserve app using your charge card. The alternative is placing a check in the gray lockbox which is located in the ice room in the central courts ramada, put the player's name in the memo section.

Volunteer Opportunities: Interested in volunteering for our big **February tournament**? If you are interested in being a part of this event email secretary@pcpickleball.org. Many of the chairpersons will contact last year's volunteers to identify the number planning to volunteer another year, then they will be looking for new volunteers. There are so many fun volunteer areas and several shifts over the days of the event. Some of the volunteer work includes infrastructure, managing parking, baking, registration, photography, setup, breakdown, and much more.

In your life before PebbleCreek were you a nurse? an EMT? a doctor? In the medical profession? If so, we need you during our tournaments. We always provide a First Aid Station and "medics" that walk around verifying no one is injured or in need of help. We currently have three tournaments a year, February, March and November. Name Badges: When members order a new name badge, the timeline to receive your badge is generally 2-3 weeks. Currently, the Club collects and submits the badge orders once every 7-10 days. The engraving takes a few days to complete each batch. Our volunteer, Dotti Kirkpatrick, then picks up the finished badges, emails each badge member and places the new badges on the whiteboard in the ice room. 












PebbleCreek Pickleball & Pachyderms

PebbleCreek's Ninth Annual Pickleball Tournament returns February 26th, 27th and 28th. Why an image of a elephant playing pickleball? It's to let you know about the opportunity to bid on a fabulous African Photo Safari at our silent auction on Thursday February 27th from 10:30 AM until 2:00 PM.

The club offers three separate silent auctions during the tournament, a new auction everyday. There will be many exciting items up for bid. We recently revised the RR charts in the boxes @ North Courts. Wait...does that mean you won't necessarily be on the same court for four of your six games? Yep, PebbleCreek Pickleball members Craig Weber and Doug Cushing have worked for the past year creating charts with mathematically-generated rotations that will actually keep you rotating! As obvious as this sounds, keep in mind that each chart (whether it be two courts with 8, 9 or 10 players; or four courts with 16, 17 or 18 players) all had to be uniquely configured so that each player plays a different court, different side, different position and different players as much as possible. As this was entirely voluntary on behalf of Doug and Craig (supplies included), be sure to thank them when the sun is in your opponents' eyes as much as it's in yours or when you get to serve as often as your nemesis. Even though our Round Robins are a Traditional format, we like to make them as fair and equitable as possible. Thank you Craig and Doug!
